

STRATEGIC RESULTS **2017**

For 80 years, the B.C. Aviation Council has worked to grow the profile of aviation and aerospace in British Columbia. Below are some examples of our efforts to achieve a visible, connected and thriving aviation and aerospace industry.

Increasing Visibility

Objective: The Industry's history, size, scope, and impact become well known to members, politicians, civil servants, educators, journalists, and the public in B.C. and elsewhere.

Results:

- Social Media following up 22%
- Corporate, Individual and especially Student Membership have all increased, reaching a total of 340 members
- Signed affiliation agreement with the Canadian Council for Aviation and Aerospace (CCAA)
- Hosted affiliates of BCAC to Board of Directors meetings including COPA and Hope Air
- Supported the Aviation Leadership Foundation's Mentorship Program
- Hosted a sold-out membership dinner in November with guest speaker Michael Benson, Provincial Air Tanker Program, BC Wildfire Service
- Hosted a free sold-out networking event for youth engagement in May at the Dublin Crossing Pub in Vancouver
- Hosted a very well-received Silver Wings Awards at the Vancouver Convention Centre, awarding six industry awards and a record 15 scholarships totalling \$28,500 plus a 50 hour commercial float plane endorsement through the new Harbour Air Advanced Float Plane Endorsement scholarship (value \$25,000)
- Hosted annual Airports Workshop and BCAC's AGM in Cranbrook
- Fundraised through YVR's Annual Koffee Klutch for scholarship fund adding \$1480 to the fund.
- Published 33 E-News Articles
- Partnered with the Waypoint Aviation Connections event held on September 28 at the Simon Fraser University downtown campus, with organizations such as YVR, BCIT, WestJet, Air Canada, TSB, InterVISTAS, Nav Canada and more in attendance.
- Attended Langley Secondary School to speak with students in the new Aviation Explorations class
- Attended the Canadian Aviation Hall of Fame Gala at Vancouver International Airport to honour four new inductees including B.C. Entrepreneur Danny Sitnam, CEO and President of Helijet International

BCAC's membership has soared, reaching 340 and climbing.
